Competitive Tests – Information

- Competitive Test Scores can be claimed for **one** (1) month following approval and publication of the event on the BIS Website. This will usually be done within one week of the close of competition but can take longer
- If a skater achieves the competitive test score on **three** separate occasions, they will need to claim the relevant level or will become ineligible for competition until they have claimed the competitive test
- Candidates applying for tests must already hold at least one segment (Elements / Free; Pattern Dance / Short Dance / Free Dance) of the discipline at the level below the test they are applying for. In the event they only hold one of the segments at the lower level on gaining the higher test they will be credited with, and required to pay for, the missing segment at the lower level. The only exceptions being overseas skater entering the UK Test System and skaters of Advanced Novice Level and above transferring from another discipline
- If a test is pending at National level, it cannot be automatically transferred to being claimed competitively. This would require confirmation from the Test Organiser that the skater has not been scheduled in and can delay the process of claiming the competitive test score
- Solo Dance Scores for the 2019 / 2020 season will be confirmed and published as soon as the new criteria is set
- Please ensure you use the up-to-date form from the BIS website and pay the amount as per the form and the current BIS Price List. Failure to do so could result in a delay to processing any application and potentially missing the deadline

Scores for competitive tests may be achieved in:

- a) All BIS permitted and approved Open competitions and Championships using the current Generic Criteria, Solo Dance Series Criteria or ISU criteria for the season. Adult Competitions do *not* use these criteria. Some restrictions on rink sizes below 56 m x 26 m will apply
- b) International Competitions and Championships using the ISU criteria for the season and where the majority of both the Technical panel and Judging panel are drawn from the ISU Officials list for the season subject to the following conditions:
 - i. Where no more than one member of the Technical Panel is not on the ISU Officials list for the season
 - ii. When 5 Judges and a separate Referee are present no more than one Judge is not on the ISU Officials list (i.e. if fewer than 5 judges, all MUST be on the ISU Officials list, and there must be a separate Referee)

N.B. In Singles skating, Basic Novice (A) Competitive Test Scores can be used to claim levels 5 and 6, however each level must be claimed from separate events. Similarly, Intermediate Novice Competitive Test Scores can be used to claim levels 7 and 8, however each level must be claimed from separate events.
